#### Visionary Gurukul Alumni

Gurukula is an Indian tradition –where the teacher and the student stay and learn together, where the knowledge is free, where the physique is strengthened, character is formed, and the intellect is expanded making the student a perfect human being. To rebuild this tradition in the modern India, Sri P.V. Narasimha Rao, the then education minister of Andhra Pradesh established AP Residential Schools at Sarvail (1971), Tadikonda and Kodigenahalli in 1972 and APRJC in Nagarjuna Sagar at 1975. Fascinated by the excellent performance of Gurukuls, DR. N.T. Rama Rao, when he was the chief minister established 46 schools with 2 schools in each district (one each for Boys & Girls) in 1983 and 3 B.C. Vidyapeeth's in 1987 at Srisailam, Simhachalam and Nagarjuna Sagar. Now the tree of Gurukul is a giant with many branches giving shade and fruits to the society. These Gurukuls were established by Visionary leaders who saw education as a transformational tool not just for the rural poor but also for the society at large. Five decades later, their vision is a grand success with many more schools serving people from different backgrounds and many alumni as leaders and contributors to society. Now, many of us are in a position to contribute back to the schools but unsure of how to make a qualitative contribution. This organization fills that need, as an umbrella organization of all the alumni associations.

#### **About Visionary Gurukul**

Several of us were working with our own alma maters in various activities such as student training, coaching for competitive exams. As we got to know each other we realized that we could benefit from each other from reusing the resources, establishing best practices, and expanding the successful programs to other schools. That led to the starting of joint programs such as:

- 1. Career Counseling Programs
- 2. Value Education, Personality development sessions
- 3. CA Foundation Classes

- 4. Supporting IIT JEE ,NEET
- 5. Kitchen Garden Development

Encouraged by the overwhelming success of these joint programs, with a strong desire to replicate this success by making it easy for the alumni to participate, we formed a federation of all old students associations of all Gurukul schools and colleges located in Telugu states.

#### **Purpose of Visionary Gurukul**

- 1. **To increase the effectiveness of programs** by supporting the programs by alumni throughout their life cycle- incubation, trial, expansion, and operations phases.
- 2. To help the alumni who are unsure of how they can contribute beyond donations by connecting them to programs at various stages that can use their time, skills, and capacity.

#### How Visionary Gurukul functions

We rely on existing alumni groups. We see our role only as an Enabler- both for the school and each of the alumni.

- Supports establishing alumni association for each school and college
- Strengthen the existing alumni
- Promote brotherhood among different alumni groups of every school and college
- This forum is not a substitute for those groups

#### **Activities of Visionary Gurukul**

The organization mainly supplements the formal activities by government to improve the Quality of performance of Gurukul schools and colleges

#### Specifically we encourage the following kinds of programs:

- 1. *What cannot be taught in classrooms:* For instance, introduction to various careers can only be done by the people in those careers.
- 2. *Experimental programs:* Some of the newer pedagogical tools are not yet part of standard curriculums. For instance e-learning programs.
- 3. *Career exam-oriented programs:* Most schools and colleges are not in a position to train students for career or scholarship exams. They are excellent candidates for our programs.
- 4. *Overall development programs:* While schools focus on usual subjects, some of the life skills such as cooking, cleaning, speaking, writing, leadership is not taught. We can fill that vacuum.

- 5. *Programs that take additional resources:* Some programs such as gardening, cleaning, or special training require additional equipment, resources, and know-how. They can only be done with the assistance of alumni organizations.
- 6. Motivational programs for the teachers at the society level to own the development of their schools.
- 7. Programs for involving the parents and public in the development of schools.

Residential System and Statewide College and entrance based selection of students: This is a Statewide Residential College established by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in 1982 under the aegis of Andhra Pradesh Residential Educational Institutions Society set up in the undivided state of Andhra Pradesh. The aim is to provide education of "Academic Excellence" and "all round development" of the students. Students are selected through an entrance examination from all the regions of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Even after the State bifurcation, the students of both the states are given admission. There is no tuition fee and the students are provided free boarding and lodging. The traditional "GURUKUL" style of education, in which both the teacher and student lived together under the same roof, is now translated into the modern residential institutions. This is a Best Performing Residential Degree College in the State in terms of not only pass percentage but also percentage of students, who got first classes and distinctions. Progression wise also it is a Best Performing Residential Degree College in terms of admission in Central Universities, IITs / NITs. Most of our students got good ranks in PG entrance tests both at National and Regional Institutes.

The only Government College in Andhra Pradesh State, which has secured All India rank band of 201-300 (NIRF) in the India Rankings 2024 under college category.
